On Sunday we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, or the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

In reflecting on the feast, Pope Francis has expressed that God knows how short our memories can be and because of this "He left us a memorial," which goes far beyond words or signs. "He gave us Food, for it is not easy to forget something we have actually tasted. He left us Bread in which He is truly present, alive and true, with all the flavour of His love." The Eucharist, he said, is no mere memory, it is a fact. "In Mass the death and resurrection of Jesus are set before us." As many of our Parish remain at home until the Pandemic truly subsides, let us pray for all those who have not been able to participate in Holy Communion over the last year and for whom the Eucharist is still a memory. May we be reunited around the altar soon yet know still the strength of our union in Christ.

Gift Aid News: if you use the Gift Aid envelopes these will probably be running out soon. The new ones have arrived, so please see our volunteer Gift Aid Coordinator, Steve Smith, after Mass to collect your new set of boxes. Thank you.

The Cemetery Project: our cemetery is a World Heritage site, but has no funding other than we can raise ourselves. To help care for our cemetery a member of the Parish is completing a cycle ride from London to Brighton next month on 13th June. **Giovanni would like to say a huge 'THANK YOU'** for your support and encouragement. Please note that all the monies raised will help fund the professional mapping and care of our cemetery for the future. **The first stage of the project is likely to cost £3,000** so, although he has set a much lower target, do please continue to sponsor him by donating what you can via this JustGiving [LINK](#) as any amount will be a great help and can be boosted by up to 25% by Gift Aid set against UK tax.

The government has updated its response roadmap for the easing of COVID-19 restrictions to combat the virus and **we remain at Step 3**. The government says that each step in the roadmap will be guided by 'data not dates' and that a week's notice will be provided before any new step is taken. We remain with the present individual or 'family bubbles' of up to 6 people together at Mass but still cannot mix these bubbles yet.



At Step 3 the main changes that to note are that not much has changed:

masks and social distancing remain, the Holy Water stoups must remain unfilled, the Sign of the Peace remains suspended and Holy Communion remains under one kind.

What is possible now is that

Fr Adrian is able to say 'The Body of Christ' to each Communicant and they are able to respond 'Amen.'

We also hope to be able to return soon to having Altar Servers at St Mary Magdalen's so look out for further news.

In case you hadn't heard ... there seemed to be surprise in the national media to learn that twice divorced Prime Minister Boris Johnson had married his fiancée Carrie Symonds in Westminster Cathedral. As with any couples who seek to marry in the Catholic Church a minimum of six months (and in their case ten months) of preparation has to occur, to establish if a couple are free to marry by their understanding of the Teaching of the Church and proof both in Civil and Canon Law that they are not already married to another person. Prime Minister Boris Johnson was baptised Catholic as a child. Canon Law states that a Catholic should marry in a Catholic church and, as both his previous marriages were not Catholic ceremonies, neither were recognised as legitimate marriages. Catholic Canon law does not permit the remarriage of a divorcee whose former spouse is still alive yet, as both marriages were annulled in preparation for the wedding (through their not being Catholic ceremonies), as both Prime Minister Boris Johnson and Carrie Symonds are baptised Catholics they have now entered a Sacramental union. The now Mrs Johnson is a lifelong Catholic who, prior to her marriage to the Prime Minister, had never been married before.
