4th Sunday of Easter: Parish Mass Book p. 268 to 271

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, and is also known as Vocations Sunday. The priesthood has always been essential to the life of the Church, from the time of Jesus until today. Good Shepherd Sunday is the day we pray for vocations, for our priests, and take up the Priest Training Fund second collection. This fund pays for the formation of men to become priests in our Archdiocese. After their ordination, our priests dedicate their lives to serving Christ and His people in our parishes, hospitals, schools, chaplaincies, prisons and in service to the needy, throughout South London, Kent and Surrey. We are blessed to have six men in formation to the Priesthood for our Archdiocese and another four who are to be ordained this year

A prayer for Vocations: Gracious and loving God,

we thank you for the gift of our priests; help them to be strong in their vocation and become instruments of your love and grace. Send your Holy Spirit to give courage and guidance to all those you are calling to the priesthood, deaconate and religious life in our Archdiocese. Heavenly Father, form us all in the likeness of your Son, Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd, so that we may love you more deeply and serve you more faithfully. Last Sunday we welcomed members of the Knights and Ladies of Marshall in commemoration of the lives of Sir James and Lady Marshall in their service to the Lord and especially to the people of Ghana. **We were extremely blessed to receive a cheque for £1000 from the Ladies and the Knights so that a presentation of £2000 was made towards the Cemetery Scanning Project, where each grave is to be individually mapped and recorded. We are indebted to the Marshallan Family as, with their donation and thanks to the £1,420.42 raised by Giovanni in last years sponsored bike ride, we will soon have enough money for this project to begin.** We are grateful to the small group of volunteers who help to maintain the grounds of the Cemetery but the Cemetery Scanning Project is a much bigger mission for the Parish to undertake and needs a professional architectural review of every grave.
