Our Second Collection this week is the annual collection for the Apostleship of the Sea (AoS), the Catholic Church's maritime agency that provides spiritual and welfare support to seafarers arriving in Great Britain and ports around the world.

Through its extensive network of port chaplains and ship visitors, AoS offers pastoral and practical assistance to seafarers who work far from home, separated from their families, and sometimes in harsh working conditions.

Nearly 95% of what we consume in Britain arrives by ship crewed by seafarers and we are dependent upon them to bring us what we need. Due to advances in technology, modern ships no longer spend weeks in port but these days unload and load their cargoes within days or hours. Seafarers, many of whom come from Catholic countries such as the Philippines, Poland and India, spend up to nine months at a time at sea, away from their families.

AoS port chaplains and ship visitors offer seafarers practical assistance such as providing phone cards and internet access so they can communicate with their loved ones back home, and spiritual and emotional support including arranging for Mass and prayer services on board ships and being a friend to them. ### **Bishop thanks those who opposed radical abortion amendment**

Bishop John Sherrington, Lead Bishop for Life Issues at the Bishops' Conference, has thanked the thousands of people who contacted their MP to register their opposition to an amendment that could have led to abortion on demand in England and Wales. The controversial amendment to the Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Bill was withdrawn on Monday, 5 July. Bishop Sherrington said: "Thank you to the thousands of people who lobbied MPs and helped to prevent dangerous amendments to the bill from moving forward. "I welcome the fact that the radical amendment (New Clause 55), which was well outside the scope of the bill, was withdrawn. It would have swept away the few protections remaining for the unborn child and enabled abortion on demand as well as removing the possibility of the doctors' conscientious objection. "The abortion clinic censorship zone amendment (New Clause 42) was also helpfully withdrawn. We must stay vigilant to attempts to widen access to abortion by hijacking other bills."

**Covid Complications** Please continue to be vigilant about anti-Covid measures such as the use of Facemasks, social distancing and hand washing. Many people are beginning to 'drop their guard' and (seen justifiably by many) to grumble over the restrictions we have had to endure. There are no announcements yet on how places of worship will have their restrictions changed after 19 July, but it is likely that the use of masks and social distancing will remain. **Please don't forget:** if you come down with cold or flu symptoms or have a cough which lasts a few days you have to self-isolate until you have a negative test. Fr Adrian had to have a 24 isolation this week following symptoms but had a negative PCR test and is Covid-clear.

**Exactly a year before the government's deadline for EU, EEA and Swiss citizens living in the UK to apply for Settled Status, a bishop who has gone through the process is urging people not to delay in making their application. Bishop William Kenney, auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham and himself a Swedish national, says those who are eligible should apply well ahead of 30 June 2021.**

The government requires European citizens who have made their homes in the UK to make an application or risk losing their fundamental rights to live and work here. Everyone including children needs to go through the process. Bishop Kenney warned that while many people have found it straightforward, others have faced unexpected obstacles navigating the government's system or don't even realise they're required to apply. **If you know someone who needs to apply for Settled Status, please urge them to get their applications in early. If you know of anyone who might need some support with the application process, or you can provide such help, please let us know via the Parish Office, thank you.**
