Pope Francis calls for prayers after the shipwreck off the Italian coast. Linda Bordoni from Vatican News comments that following yet another migrant tragedy in the Mediterranean, Pope Francis sends an online message with his sorrow and urges all men and women of goodwill not to be indifferent in the face of continuing migrant deaths during dangerous sea crossings and journeys of hope. Pope Francis' @Pontifex tweet on Thursday, 10 August said: "With sorrow I heard about the news of the shipwreck involving migrants in the Mediterranean Sea. Let us not remain indifferent to these tragedies, and let us pray for the victims and their families." His message was in response to the sinking of yet another migrant boat off the shores of Italy. Forty-one people died on Wednesday when the vessel transporting them from Tunisia to Italy capsized. Four survivors were rescued by a Maltese cargo ship and taken to Lampedusa by the Italian coastguard. The survivors, from Ivory Coast and Guinea, said that 45 people had been on board, including three children. The vessel reportedly set off last Thursday and travelled for around six hours before it was capsized by a large wave. As people continue to lose their lives at sea, the Holy Father remains steadfast in his mission to sensitise the people and institutions that so often turn to look the other way.

Catholic Nursery/Reception, Secondary School Transfers and 6th Form Applications for 2024

If you're applying to a Catholic School for next year, please see Fr Adrian after Mass to obtain a form called the **Parish Reference Request"**. This form, with a family photo and a COPY of the child's baptism certificate, together with any school forms for Fr Adrian to complete (the school SIF if you already have them) are to be handed back to Fr Adrian at the end of the usual Sunday Mass you attend. Please do not delay returning the Parish form until you have all the school forms, as Fr Adrian needs time to collate the information. Please make sure you are aware of each School's cut-off date, e.g., Secondary Schools will need their completed forms over the next few weeks. Please remember that at least a week is needed to give time to process the forms so that forms handed in one Sunday are usually returned the next week. Please see Fr Adrian if you have any questions.








Each year we have some children who have not yet been baptised or are from different faith traditions, so if that applies to you, an extra application is needed for your child to become Catholic.

Chaplains bring comfort and solidarity in Ukraine

Ukrainian military chaplains are extending a helping hand to communities by offering spiritual guidance, practical aid, and a message of hope to those affected by the devastating consequences of war. Agnel Maria reports for Vatican News that "As war continues to bring death and destruction in Ukraine, military chaplains are reaching out to soldiers and civilians. The chaplains comfort and reaffirm the people to not lose hope. To do so they have also created a bond with officials and with medical staff working in the war zones. They try to instil peace and comfort in the minds of the soldiers. Amidst the conflict, Father Rostyslav Vysochan, a Ukrainian Catholic priest and second lieutenant in the armed forces, finds profound purpose in his role as a chaplain. Deployed to the front line in the aftermath of Russia's incursion into Crimea and the separatist activities in Donetsk and Luhansk, Father Vysochan embraces his duty with conviction. He tries to guide soldiers through the moral dilemma of engaging in combat to defend one's country.

Father Vysochan assists the soldiers in dealing with the stress of having to kill in order to save lives and ministers the Sacrament of Confession, through which soldiers find solace and inner peace. He's been joined on several journeys to the war front by deacons from his church, and now some of them make their own visits to minister to the growing number of widows and their children. Their van is always stocked with essential items, which they readily distribute to civilians they encounter on their path. Whether it's an elderly person or a couple of soldiers grappling with a tire issue, the chaplains stop to offer their support, demonstrating their companionship. Beyond their spiritual responsibilities, the chaplains extend their reach through practical acts of kindness. When encountering wounded soldiers at a stabilization point, they provide food and set up amenities such as a coffee machine. The journeys of these Ukrainian military chaplains embody dedication, compassion, and a steadfast commitment to providing physical, emotional, and spiritual support to all affected by war. Their actions exemplify the profound role that chaplains play in times of crisis, fostering resilience, unity, and hope."

We Continue to pray at every Mass for the people of Ukraine and for Russia to seek peace and pray the Rosary for Peace during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament each Friday from 9am before the 9.30am Mass – all are welcome to join us in prayer.
