This weekend we celebrate CAFOD Family Fast Day

This Lent CAFOD are encouraging us to raise awareness and funds for those who struggle to access water. This life-giving commodity is something that many of us take for granted, but those in remote areas often have to walk for miles to ensure that there is enough water for themselves and their families. The Diocese would like to thank parishioners who regularly donate to CAFOD and who participate each year in the alms-giving at Lent or the October Family Fast Day. By consuming a smaller meal and donating the money saved to CAFOD, the charity can help turn around the lives of the poorest by providing bore-holes and solar powered water pumps to remote communities, helping to bring water, health and sanitation. Calling all budding Historians, Archaeologists and Surveyors! Fr Adrian would like to continue the recent practice of allowing Parish members to have their ashes buried in the cemetery and has requested permission from the Archbishop to allow this. By allowing more families to lay their loved ones to rest here, funds will be generated to help care for memorials for future generations. We have discovered 287 spaces where there is no record in the Plot Register so we need teams of volunteers to help identify the areas where burials can occur and need to ensure that the vacant plots are where we think they are.

To do this, we need to check these vacant plots with known markers or graves, which is where you could help.

We are aiming for four to six sessions during weekends. Please email Clare at MortlakeAdmin@RCAOS.org.uk with your availability in March or April so we can collate teams to work together. Equally, if anyone has any archaeological, historical or surveying expertise, we would also be very interested to hear from you. You could be a Team Leader to help the socially-distanced groups in order to make this as time-efficient as possible. **Our Catholic Church Teaching emphasises the importance of the sanctity of life and the care of our loved ones after death through our belief in the bodily resurrection.**

Words from our funeral rite emphasise that life is “changed, not ended” when we die. Please help to make history, by being part of history, so that our Cemetery has a future. It can be possible with your help. Thank you.

Holy Innocents’ Church Orpington, has organised a series of webinars on the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. The opportunity to participate is open to anyone who wishes to attend. The webinars will take place on three consecutive Wednesdays in March and be led by the renowned biblical scholar, Father Henry Wansbrough, a Benedictine monk from Ampleforth Abbey:

The Passion & Death of Jesus according to the Synoptic Gospels

Wednesday 10 March 2021 at 7.45 - 9.15 pm

The Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus according to John

Wednesday 17 March 2021 at 7.45 - 9.15 pm

The Death and Resurrection of Jesus according to the writings of Paul

Wednesday 24 March 2021 at 7.45 - 9.15 pm

These free webinars offer an opportunity to increase personal insights into the historical context and theology expressed in the different accounts, with a view to understanding what the Resurrection means for the mission of the Church and for our spirituality. Father Henry Wansbrough has written over twenty books. He edited the New Jerusalem Bible (1985) and recently single-handedly the Revised New Jerusalem Bible (2019). He has lectured in Africa, Australia and North America. He was for twelve years Master of St Benet’s Hall in Oxford also Chair of the Oxford University Faculty of Theology and more recently Professor of Biblical Studies at Liverpool Hope University. He has served on several Vatican Commissions, including the Pontifical Biblical Commission and the Anglican Roman Catholic international Commission. England and Wales will come together to pray on 2 March 2021

Bishops from all over Europe, through their Bishops’ Conferences, will join together during Lent to celebrate a series of Masses and pray for the victims of Covid-19. The continent has suffered over 770,000 deaths from the virus. The initiative, promoted by the Council of European Bishops’ Conferences, aims to offer a sign of communion and hope for the entire continent. Each nation, or nations in our case, will come together to celebrate Holy Mass on a designated day to be part of this continental prayer network – a Eucharistic chain. Cardinal Vincent Nichols, Vice President of the Council of European Bishops’ Conferences, will celebrate a special live-streamed Mass on Tuesday, 2 March 2021, at 17:30 in Westminster Cathedral. Bishops across England and Wales will also celebrate Masses in their own dioceses. Since the start of the pandemic, bishops from across Europe have added their voices to that of Pope Francis to reiterate the Church’s closeness to all those struggling with coronavirus – the victims and their families, the sick, health and social care workers, the volunteers and all those on the front line at this challenging time.
