We have been blessed to have been joined by members of the School Choir recently over our Easter Masses and will have their joyful ministry of music and song again this Sunday and on 27 June. Whilst it is still not possible to sing together as a congregation such music ministry is a joy indeed and we are grateful to Mrs Carlton, Mrs O'Gorman and the choir for their being able to join us.

Thank you to those who were able to join us in the three-week trial of seeing if a weekday Mass at 9am was preferable to the congregation. As preference remained for 'as before', from Monday 10 May we will return to the 9.30 Mass schedule as listed below.

During May, traditionally the 'Month of Mary', we have begun a new tradition for the timing of our **Friday Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction.**

From now on each Friday there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 9am with a rotation of the prayers of the Mysteries of the Rosary each week, closing with Latin Benediction before the 9.30am Mass. This change is to allow the continuation of **Mothers' Prayers** each Friday as, during Lockdown, the timing has moved to 10.30am. <p>At the weekly General Audience this week, Pope Francis reflected on contemplative prayer.</p> <p>He said every human person has a "contemplative dimension" which is like salt that gives flavour to our day. We can contemplate birds chirping, the sun rising, or art and music. "To contemplate is not primarily a way of doing, but a way of being," said the Pope. Yet, added Pope Francis, the contemplative aspect of our nature requires us to enter into faith and love before it can become prayer. "Being contemplatives does not depend on the eyes, but on the heart," he noted. "And here prayer enters into play as an act of faith and love, as the 'breath' of our relationship with God." The Pope said prayer purifies our heart and sharpens our gaze, "allowing it to grasp reality from another point of view."</p> <p>Citing the Holy Curé of Ars, he said "contemplation is a gaze of faith, fixed on Jesus." "Everything comes from this: from a heart that feels that it is looked on with love. Then reality is contemplated with different eyes." Referring again to St. John Vianney, Pope Francis said loving contemplation of Christ requires few words and can be put simply: "I look at Him and He looks at me!" "A gaze is enough," said the Pope. "It is enough to be convinced that our life is surrounded by an immense and faithful love that nothing can ever separate us from." Jesus, he added, was the master of this gaze, always finding time and space to be in loving communion with God the Father.</p> <p>Pope Francis then warned against falling into the ancient temptation of thinking contemplation is opposed to action. He said some spiritual masters of the past advocated this dualistic understanding of prayer. "In reality, in Jesus Christ and the Gospel, there is no opposition between contemplation and action," said the Pope. He said the only great call in the Gospel is to follow Jesus along the path of love. "This is the pinnacle and centre of everything. In this sense, charity and contemplation are synonymous; they say the same thing."</p>	
<p>'Beyond the Cross' is a five-part art and culture series that follows the Risen Christ through the artist's eye taking in some of the main encounters of the season of Easter. In this week's video we look to the empty tomb and take inspiration from the Swiss painter Eugene Burnand's 1898 work 'The Disciples Peter and John Running to the Sepulchre on the Morning of the Resurrection' which hangs in the Musée d'Orsay in Paris. <p>The IT Department from the Diocese has sent this message as a reminder: a barrage of delivery scam texts has recently been circulating pretending to be from DPD and Royal Mail. These texts claim that you have missed a delivery and ask you to reschedule for a small fee, thereby obtaining your bank details. To avoid falling victim to these scam messages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Think about whether you've ordered anything recently. Keep track of receipts or confirmation emails for online retailers and recently bought items. • Don't click on anything. Go to the shipper's website to see if the tracking number is real. • If a message is asking for money or personal or financial information in exchange for a package, it's likely a scam. • Check the 'from' address - is it from the appropriate company or organisation? It is worth noting that scammers often change their names to make the correspondence look like they're from a legitimate company. • Is the greeting impersonal as fraudsters often use subjects or greetings that are impersonal and general? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Is there poor spelling, grammar or presentation? While scammers are getting better at making their messages look more professional, a more common thing to look out for lack of consistency in the email, like different font styles or sizes, and mismatching logos.
