Please be careful of scams as a parishioner whose mobile phone had been in the newsletter was contacted with a false message asking for money such as via Google Play or Amazon. Neither Fr Adrian nor anyone in the Parish would contact you in this way. If you get any suspicious or seemingly genuine text or email always, without clicking on any links, hover the cursor over them to check if the link is genuine or not. Please remember to check the text of messages as spelling mistakes and close to but not exact names such as Magdalene instead of Magdalen without the 'e' or requests for urgent help in getting a gift or help with lost luggage should raise suspicions. If it is an email please report it to <a href="report@phishing.gov.uk">report@phishing.gov.uk</a> and if it's a text message you can forward the text to 7726 (which is free).

Following recent scam messages (see the front page) please note the details given below are genuine ways that donations can be given to the Parish. We don't ask you to give a certain amount, as this varies according to a person's income, but please consider the total amount you give each week or each month to the general needs and charitable work of the Parish. We are all in difficult financial positions from the current state of our economy and not everyone may be able to pledge financially, but we hope people can donate their time and talents to help the Parish as well.

We do need your help and donations, so please continue to support the Church in these ways ... The easiest way to donate to the Parish for the weekly collection is to set-up a standing order donation from your bank which can be Gift-Aided if you pay tax on UK income or savings. The same form can be used to set-up weekly or monthly giving depending on your preference even if you are not a Tax Payer. The Parish bank account details are always listed on the front left of the newsletter and can be used via your own banking App or to complete a standing order form. The forms have recently changed but existing standing orders are not affected by the changes. As we have the roof repairs and other safety measures to meet over the next few weeks (and years!) we do need to raise funds for these costs. To do so please note that from this Sunday onwards, for every pound donated to the Parish 70 pence will go to the charitable work, Mission and Ministry of the Parish and 30 pence will be ring fenced to help the Health and Safety repairs. It would be a great blessing if you would consider setting-up a new donation to our safety repairs fund called "Building Together". These forms are available from the back of the church or online HERE.
