2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent: Parish Mass Book p. 85-88 Prepare the Way... As we learnt last week, we symbolize our journey to Christmas through our purple linen (representing the colour of preparation and penance); the gradual lighting of our Advent candles, the Magi on their journey to Christ, our 'gift of prayer' labels and Jesse Tree on our sanctuary. Over the course of last week we placed the first symbols on our Jesse Tree: a dove reminding us of the peace and harmony of creation as God intended; a fruit representing the original sin of Adam and Eve to remind us that Jesus is the New Adam who wipes away that sin; Noah's ark, reminding us of God's covenant to save his people; a field of stars, showing that we are God's children in fulfilment of his promise to Abraham; a ram, representing the sacrifice Abraham made to God and a link to the ultimate sacrifice of God's own Son. After this we have Jacob's ladder as a reminder that Heaven and Earth are united in God's care; Joseph's sacks of grain to represent God's provision, even in difficult times and this Sunday we place the symbol of the burning bush to represent the presence of the Lord and our personal response to how God calls us, even today. The use of the crib figures and a Jesse Tree during the Advent season is a great way to remind us of the Bible stories that lead us to Jesus and over the coming weeks we will look at the different symbols that represent these Bible figures. Prayer gift-tags can be decorated and placed on our Prayer Tree as signs of remembering our loved ones in prayer. The Prayer Tree is lit-up in front of the Sacred Heart Statue. We hope that these labels of love will stand out as a gift of prayer that witnesses to God's love and care for us and to all those we hold in our hearts during this season of Advent.

Can you spare some time to help decorate our Church at Christmas? If so, please come along and join the team from 11<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> Dec., and again on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> to help decorate our church & tree (from 10am each day). If you can donate a Poinsettia(s), for the church then please bring it/them along until Friday 23<sup>rd</sup>.

First Holy Communion News. Please note that the registration process ended over a month ago, with those who signed-up for the programme now entering the next stage of the process, with parents collecting the actual First Communion Application from Fr Adrian after Mass. We have printed an application form for every family who registered. We have 36 children this year, 13 of whom are at other Schools and 7 of whom attend different Parishes. For children to make their First Holy Communion they should attend Mass each Sunday, and we encourage children to attend our Children's Liturgy at the 9.30 am Mass, though you are welcome to attend any of our Masses. For the 29 families who attend this Parish either at our School, or another one, please collect the Communion



Application from Fr Adrian after Mass over the next few Sundays. The 7 families at our School seeking Communion here can collect the application from the School, but they must have the permission of both Fr Adrian and their own Parish Priest to celebrate Communion here. Please note, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December. Those at the Parish School can drop their forms there and the School will forward them, if you are one of the 13 families at other Schools, please return your form to Fr Adrian in person after Mass. Don't forget, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December, thank you.

Advent can be such a busy demanding time, but we encourage you to make some space to reflect and pray this season by signing up for our free Diocesan daily reflections to aid your prayer. Those who sign up will receive an email with a brief thought for the day based on the daily reading. Please sign up via www.southwarkdsc.org.uk/ and then clicking on the Advent Reflection box. Alternatively, you can sign up for these reflections by clicking HERE in the online version of the newsletter.

Following last week's personal message from Fr Adrian, where he mentioned that he was having treatment under the Royal Marsden Hospital, Fr Adrian will be meeting this week with Fr Peter Andrews, a retired Priest from Ham who will be able to offer help to the Parish. Fr Adrian has requested that the Diocese will, through Fr Peter's help, will ensure that all that goes on in the Parish, whether Mass, baptism or First Communion will be "business as usual". Many in the Parish go away at Christmas, and though Fr Adrian won't be having surgery until after the new school terms starts next year, do please see him after Mass to send him your thoughts and prayers and, especially if you are going to be away for Christmas, do please send him a card. Don't forget, that if you require a school reference, you will need to see Fr Adrian before 11th December to request the Parish Reference Form so that he can complete the school SIF.

#### A New Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Southwark.

On Monday 28 November 2022 it was announced that His Holiness Pope Francis has appointed Mgr Philip Moger as an Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Southwark. A priest of the Diocese of Leeds for 40 years, Bishop-Elect Moger has, until now, been the Rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Walsingham in Norfolk.
