The Lord is compassion and love Ps 102 v8

Local World Day of Prayer Service Friday 4th March

This year's World Day of Prayer service (formerly the Women's World Day of Prayer) has been prepared by a representation of Christian women from England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission

A two-year 'synodal' process is taking place in the Catholic Church that culminates in the final Synod Gathering of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. The overall theme is "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission".

The Synodal process is an invitation for us, as Catholics, to 'walk together' and every member of the Church has the right to speak, and the obligation to allow those charged with the work of discernment the freedom to do so.

Fr Adrian organised our Parish contribution so that people could contribute online, by email and in person at a meeting after Mass so that Parish members could contribute to the series of questions and summary accounts.

Two Parish Members, Fiona Hoyle and Andreas Williams helped to consolidate our Parish views and brought them to a Diocesan-wide meeting of representatives with the Archbishop. A summary of our views was sent to the Diocese for its inclusion in our Diocesan report to Rome as, for the first time, the Synod Office in Rome has organised a comprehensive process of feedback from Parishes around the world. This process encompasses the stated aim of the Holy Father that the Church in today's world should have a vision of missionary communion orientated to evangelisation. The process began in the 'Local' Church and now moves to the level of the Bishops' Conference. From there, discernment takes place in the Regional Area (for us England and Wales) and is steered by the European Council of Bishops' Conferences (CCEE) before moving to the Universal Church with the final Synod Gathering of Bishops in 2023.

What exactly is synodality and what does it mean for Catholics in England and Wales?

Fr Chris Thomas, General Secretary of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, and Father Jan Nowotnik, Director of Mission, discuss the process and explain this invitation to communion, participation and mission in an online video which can be viewed via <https://youtu.be/JFvfixE07iY>
