The end of Lent with the start of Holy Week and Season the joy of Easter will soon be upon us. Holy Week begins with Palm Sunday, but please note, this week's newsletter gives Lent

us the advanced notice that

we will have only one Mass at 11 am on Palm Sunday. Please note the change of time, as there will be NO Children's Mass at 9.30 am since we have the Walk of Witness that day, where local churches will gather for the start of the combined Palm Sunday Walk of Witness at 9.30 am. We will walk back in procession with the donkey to the church where there will be the opportunity for the children to meet with the donkey. The donkey is well looked after and its welfare is paramount but it is used to giving rides. Please see the Holy Week and Easter Services sheet which is available from the back of the church. This lists all the details of our Mass times over Holy Week and the Easter period. Please also see the Palm Sunday posters which give details of the route and the special timings on the day.
