Reactions from the world to news of Benedict XVI's death: As the news spreads of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI' death on Saturday 31st December, Church leaders remember the late Pope as a scholar, a gentle man, and a man of God.

Cardinal Vincent Nichols of Westminster describes Pope Benedict as a pastor, a scholar, a gentleman, and a man of God. "Pope Benedict was through and through a gentleman, through and through a scholar, through and through a pastor, through and through a man of God – close to the Lord and always, always his humble servant." The President of the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales says he has fond memories of Pope Benedict XVI's historic visit to the UK in 2010. "We saw in the person of Pope Benedict, nothing to do with the name that he'd been given of 'God's Rottweiler', but at the end of the visit, as one commentator said, he appeared as everybody's favourite grandfather." According to Cardinal Nichols, Benedict's visit to the UK in September 2010 marked a turning point for the Catholic Church: "That visit, especially the visit to Westminster Hall, still resonates – it still gives Catholic politicians a platform and a continuing respect." Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI will be prayed for at all our Masses from this weekend.
