As the initial preparation work to clear the area has already cost £700, whatever we can raise towards buying plants to screen the area would be much appreciated. Prepare the Way... As we begin the season of Advent you'll notice a few changes that highlight a change of pace in our liturgy; the easiest to spot perhaps is the purple linen, the Advent candles, the Magi on their journey to Christ and the tree on our sanctuary; however, at this stage they are not for Christmas, but are our Jesse and Prayer tree for Advent. The word "Advent" means "coming". It refers to the coming of Jesus, the promised Messiah and our time of preparation as we await his return and commemorate his birth. Until Christmas the tree stands as a symbol of this time of preparation and, the pictures on our Jesse Tree help us to know the story of God's love and care for us throughout history. The Nativity celebrates the coming of the King of kings and our tree is called a Jesse Tree after the text in Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot will come up from the stock of Jesse; from his roots a branch will bear fruit." Jesse was the father of King David, so our tree represents the 'family tree' of Jesus: in the first chapter of Matthew's Gospel, Jesus, the Messiah (the anointed King of kings), is traced from the line of king David, and back to Abraham, our forefather in faith. The use of a Jesse Tree during the Advent season is a great way to remind us of the Bible stories that lead us to Jesus and over the coming month we will look at the different symbols that represent these Bible figures. Prayer gift tags can be decorated and placed on our Prayer Tree (near the Sacred Heart statue) as signs of remembering our loved ones in prayer. We hope that these labels of love will stand out as a gift of prayer that witnesses to God's love and care for us and to all those we hold in our hearts during this season of Advent.

Please note that the registration process ended over a month ago, with those who signed-up for the programme now entering the next stage of the process, with parents collecting the actual First Communion Application from Fr Adrian after Mass. We have printed an application form for every family who registered. We have 34 children this year, 12 of whom are at other Schools and 7 of whom attend different Parishes. For children to make their First Holy Communion they should <u>attend Mass each Sunday</u>, and we encourage children to attend our Children's Liturgy at the 9.30 am Mass, though you are welcome to attend any of our Masses. For the 27 families who attend this Parish either at our School, or another one, please collect the Communion Application from Fr Adrian after Mass over the next few Sundays. The 7 families at our School seeking Communion here can collect the application from the School, but they must have the permission of both Fr Adrian and their own Parish Priest to celebrate Communion here. Please note, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16th December. Those at the Parish School can drop their forms there and the School will forward them, if you are one of the 12 families at other Schools, please return your form to Fr Adrian in person after Mass, thank you. Don't forget, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16th December.

A personal message from Fr Adrian: This weekend we begin the New Liturgical Year, with the wonderful season of Advent. Many of us start a new year with plans of how we can make changes to our lives both at home and at work. With this new beginning, and the start of a new Liturgical Year for the Church, I also have news about some changes in my life that will affect us over the next few months. Many of you know that we were praying for my identical twin, Stuart, when he had surgery for cancer in August. Thank you so much for all your prayers as he is well on the way to recovery. Unfortunately, I have been found to have the same cancer and have been cared for by my GP and the Royal Marsden Hospital since September as they guided me through the best treatment. Only a few people knew in the Parish so they could pray for me but the time has come to ask the entire Parish for your prayers as, like my brother, I too have to have surgery now. The hospital is very hopeful that all will be curative but it does mean that I will have to go into hospital mid-January 2023 and will be away from the Parish for a few months. After the operation I will need some time to recuperate before embarking on the next stage of my medical care, but the Diocese will be providing the comforting care of another Priest to help shepherd the Parish in my absence so, all that goes on in the Parish, whether Mass, baptism or First Communion will be "business as usual". Whilst you're in the care of another Priest I will need to rely on your loving care to help me get through this. I can't wait to know when I will be able to return, as I will be longing for the day, but will be keeping you in my prayers each day and every day when I'm back. Many in the Parish go away at Christmas, and though I won't be going until after the new school terms starts next year, do please see me after Mass to send me your thoughts and prayers and, especially if you are going to be away for Christmas, do please send me a card which I can keep as a memento of what a wonderful Parish I look forward to returning to.
