### Pope Francis's appeal after the death of George Floyd

During the weekly General Audience on Wednesday, Pope Francis condemned all forms of racism and exclusion. He prayed for the repose of the soul of George Floyd and all those who have lost their lives as a result of the sin of racism. The Pope also expressed his concern for the disturbing instances of violence that have sprung up during protests in cities across the United States. Quoting Archbishop José H. Gomez, the president of the US Bishops' Conference, the Holy Father stressed that "nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost." Pope Francis prayed for the consolation of the grieving families, and enjoined everyone to work towards national reconciliation and peace.

**Bishop Declan Lang, the Lead Bishop for International Affairs and Bishop Paul McAleenan, the Lead Bishop for Racial Justice from our Bishops' Conference also provided a message of support following the death of George Floyd**

"We stand in solidarity with our sisters and brothers in the USA as they challenge the evil of racism and the brutal killing of George Floyd. As the US Bishops made clear: "we cannot turn a blind eye to these atrocities and yet still try to profess to respect every human life. We serve a God of love, mercy, and justice." Systemic racism is embedded in our own society. The disproportionate harm suffered by BAME people throughout the COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted profound inequalities, marginalisation and injustice here in the UK. The peaceful Black Lives Matter protests taking place in our towns and cities this week reflect the understandable anger that so many people feel about this. **As Catholics we recognise that racism is an evil which must be opposed; we all have a responsibility for actively promoting racial justice. Whenever we ignore racism or dismiss BAME people's experience of it, we are complicit in violations of human dignity.** We pray for God's help to overcome racism in all its forms and that we might protect everyone who suffers its consequences. We are all made in God's image."

FLOS FLORUM by Lionel Johnson, 1894.  
 LILY, O Lily of the Vallies!  
 Lily, O Lily of Calvary Hill!  
 White with the glory of all graces,  
 Earth with the breath of thy pure soul fill:  
 Lily, O Lily of the Vallies!  
 Lily, O Lily of Calvary Hill!  
 Rose, O Rose of Gethsemani Garden!

 From thickets of the thornless Eden,  
 Load with rich odour each wind that blows:  
 Rose, O Rose of Gethsemani Garden!

Victorian poet and author, Lionel Johnson was a Catholic convert. He was received into Full Communion with the Church on the Feast of St Alban, 22 June 1891, at St Ethelreda’s, Ely Place, London. The officiating Priest, Father William Lockhart was an associate of Cardinal Newman. Quietly influential, Lionel Johnson lectured with W.B Yeats with whom he was great friends and introduced Lord Alfred Douglas to the playwright and author Oscar Wilde. Another family member, Rev. Lord Archibald Douglas (1850–1938) was a Roman Catholic priest. Rev. Lord Archibald Douglas was the son of Archibald Douglas, 8<sup>th</sup> Marquess of Queensberry. It was the 9<sup>th</sup> Marquess of Queensberry, John Sholto Douglas (1844–1900), who was famously sued by Oscar Wilde.
