Parish & School News

At 11 am this Sunday Fr Adrian will celebrate a live-streamed Mass from St Mary Magdalen's. A link to join the Mass, with password, is sent by email the day before. Please note: further information specific to our Parish is listed overleaf. Although we hope to be able to open our doors for Sunday Mass again soon, please read this essential message which has been updated with the latest information:

- It is important to reaffirm that, at present, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended. St Mary Magdalen's will be able to open for public Mass when we have enough volunteers to produce a Stewards' rota, with four people needed over a 2.5-hour period from 9.45-12.15 on a Sunday morning.
- Please be aware that there will be a limit on the number of people who can attend Mass. This will be determined in accordance with social distancing requirements but will differ when the church is full of scaffolding. We are asked to reflect carefully on how and when we might be able to attend Mass. We cannot return immediately to our customary practices. This is not, in any sense, a moment when we are going 'back to normal.'
- Our Bishops have asked every Catholic to think very carefully about how and when they will return to Mass. **At present there will be one Mass on a Sunday at 11am which will continue to be livestreamed via Zoom.** Fr Adrian will consider when it is possible to open up for Monday to Saturday Mass (as a separate cleaning team will be required) and when additional Masses can be celebrated at the weekends. The Sunday obligation has not yet returned as our Bishops are keen to ease the pressure of numbers for Sunday celebrations and are allowing for a gradual return to the Eucharist for people.

It is important to note that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains suspended. St Mary Magdalen's church will be able to open when there are enough volunteers to produce a Stewards' rota, however, **at present the church remains closed to the public.**

When announced the church will open from 10am to 12pm on Sundays, including livestreamed Mass from 11-11.30am for up to 60 people.

The cemetery is open daily from 9am to 3pm.

- Once our church can open, there will still be many people who cannot attend Mass in person. As a result, we plan to continue livestreaming the 11am Sunday Mass, both for those who remain shielding and vulnerable, and also for those unable to leave home because of advanced age or illness.
- When we return to having a congregation at Mass there will be quite a few differences in how the celebration has to take place. For the time being, there will be no congregational singing and Mass will be shorter than usual, with three rather than four readings and without prayers of intercession. The congregation will be expected to wear masks over their face and the Blessed Sacrament will be given after the blessing and dismissal. None of this detracts from the centrality of our encounter with the Risen Christ in the Eucharist, so please respect and follow the guidance given.

A message from Fr Adrian: our proposal for the ceiling repair, with a range of like-for-like quotes is being presented this week to the Diocesan Finance Committee. Although we need their approval for the work to go ahead, we have had confirmation from the Buildings' Surveyor that we could be able to open the church for Mass, hopefully even with all the scaffolding in place. As reported last week, our aim is to be able to open the church for a couple of hours on a Sunday. In order to do this, to keep to our safeguarding and cleaning regulations, we need to have **four teams** of at least **four people** so that each team would be volunteering in the same team once in a four-week month. We have been blessed so far with a four people who have volunteered to act as **Stewards**, but don't yet have enough volunteers to be able to open. Being a Steward requires someone who is not classed as 'shielded' or 'vulnerable' by the NHS, someone who is capable of cleaning the church surfaces with antibacterial spray (please note that PPE and cleaning materials will be provided).

If you think you could volunteer as a Steward, *perhaps even suggesting your own team of four people to work together*, please email MortlakeAdmin@RCAOS.org.uk if you can help. **The initial aim is to be able to open the church from 10 am to 12pm on Sundays, including the opportunity for a small congregation from 60 to 80 people** (depending on a mix of individuals and households) for Mass from 11 to 11.30am.

Please note: until the Diocese has given permission, St Mary Magdalen's church is still closed, with Sunday Mass livestreamed via Zoom at 11am planned to continue for the foreseeable future, even when we can open. Naturally, the aim will be to return to our normal Sunday schedule of three Mass, but this is not possible with the current level of special preparation and cleanliness that would be needed. If you are seeking for your child to be baptised, please see the note at the bottom of the page as these will begin again before public Mass.
