Following the knife attack last Sunday, our Catholic parish in Streatham organised a Day of Prayer for Unity and Peace yesterday, led by Archbishop John Wilson. On hearing the news of the attack Archbishop John stated: "For those who think that terrorism can achieve anything we commit ourselves with determination to saying 'no' to violence on our streets and within our communities. Our thoughts and prayers are with those who have been injured and with their families, and with all affected by this senseless assault. We thank our emergency services for their support and response. We will continue to stand together as a community. We will not allow this event, terrible though it is, to divide us. We are from different countries and religious beliefs, but we are united in our common humanity and our shared desire for a peaceful coexistence where every person is respected and can live in safety. As the Catholic community in Streatham we will continue to build good relations and work for the common good of all those who call this part of London their home. Violence solves nothing. We are, and remain, a people united for peace."
