Collection details for last Sunday, 22 March

Naturally, this was the first Sunday where we were unable to open the church doors, so our collection is about a third of what it normally is. That was only possible thanks to the blessing of parishioners giving by Standing Order and two people who came to drop in their Gift Aid envelopes. **We are all in such extreme circumstances that it is a blessing to be able to raise that much, so thank you to everyone.** Parish Collection £20 Standing Order £400 Total: £420

On 18 March Archbishop John Wilson issued the statement: "Few of us will have witnessed circumstances such as those we are presently experiencing. It is crucial that we take the necessary measures to maximise the welfare of every person and follow the guidance and requirements of our Government and Statutory Agencies. The Bishops of England and Wales have implemented changes in how we are to practise our faith as we move forward. ... A major change is the cessation of public celebrations of the Mass and the dispensation of the Obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days." It is no longer possible to attend church so, for the time being, the last public Mass at St Mary Magdalen's was held on Friday 20 March, nevertheless, Fr Adrian continues to celebrate Mass daily and to pray for the needs of our Parish families and Key Workers throughout the course of the day. The Catholic Bishops' Conference has reiterated the UK Government instruction on the occasions when someone can leave home which, to lessen the spread of the virus, does not include gathering together at Mass:

- Shopping for basic necessities, for example food and medicine, which must be as infrequent as possible.
- One form of exercise a day, for example a run, walk, or cycle - alone or with members of your household.
- Any medical need, or to provide help to the vulnerable.
- Travelling to and from work, but only where this absolutely cannot be done from home.

Please pray our teachers, pupils and staff as our school remains open for the children of Key Workers.

Sunday Masses: 9:30am, 11.00am & 6:30pm

Weekday Mass: the church opens at 8:30am with Mass at 9.30 am, but please check the Mass Intention List for day to day details.

Please note the church is closed on Tuesdays.

Each Sunday during Lent we pray for our candidates and, over the last three Sundays, there have been special prayers of blessing. We have one child Mya who is a Catechumen (preparing for baptism) and one adult Candidate, Jorge, who will be confirmed. Sadly, Easter will be very different this year with the church closed, but services will continue ASAP. As part of our Catholic community's **focus on the Bible during Lent**, a series of readings from Matthew's Gospel are available online each day until Easter. The Barnes Community Shop will enable you to order your groceries online and to have them delivered to your door on an eco-friendly bike. Their riders will deliver Monday to Friday between 12 and 3pm whilst we are all in quarantine. If you place an order before 12pm you can book a next day delivery. They are starting with a limited number of delivery slots every day and will try to expand these over time. However, they are asking customers to leave the slots for residents who are in isolation or find it difficult to get out.
