The positive obligation for each of us to attend Sunday Mass returned on 28th November 2021. The church is open under Covid-safety restrictions has 3 Masses on Sunday, with the weekday Mass schedule as listed below with the times and Mass intentions. We are running a trial period of 3 Sunday Masses until February 2022.

A message from Fr Adrian: This coming year will see our 170th Anniversary and though during the three and a half years I have been with the Parish we have had many months when we had to close for the Pandemic, it is wonderful that we can safely open and gather for Mass. Although we still have to keep safe and take care, when we are able to be together, it is the reality of such communion together, in our own and wider families, that gives us strength to draw on and, most especially, the strength God gives us in our lives from our spiritual and physical reception of his Blessing and Holy Communion.

Through 2020 and 2021 we have had to spend nearly £200,000 in urgent safety repairs in the Church, Hall and Cemetery and have a further £15,000 of repairs immediately in the new Year, with £500,000 of further planned repairs to come. Over the Pandemic we have not being able to undertake any major fundraising and we will need to do so during our Anniversary Year so we can continue to be Stewards of the wonderful buildings, projects and people of the Parish. **I would like to thank our Parish Finance and Building Committee members who have helped with this work and first Clare and then Anna who came to help in the Parish office over the course of Lockdown and beyond. We are indebted and give thanks to all those who support the Parish throughout the year by donating and volunteering in so many ways.** Although we've had to work very differently together for many months, it is a blessing to have the support of those who have been able to help as Readers, Extraordinary ministers, Welcomers, catechists, musicians and singers; those who've helped with the collection, our flower arrangers, church cleaners, linen cleaners and lately our Altar Servers. Thank you to you all - may we know the Lord's Blessing throughout the year ahead.

Welcome to 2022 – Happy New Year – may we continue to know the Lord’s Blessings through all our endeavours.

Thank you to the families who have returned their **First Holy Communion and Confirmation Forms for 2022.**

If you received a reminder message from Fr Adrian regarding the forms please reply to this by 4th January.

All applications closed several weeks ago and we are planning how best to prepare the classes during the continued restrictions. Under current Government and Diocesan guidelines we can safely meet for Catechism classes for both **First Holy Communion and Confirmation** as we will fulfil all the Covid-safety criteria. Fr Adrian will continue to monitor what is required from both the Government and Diocesan regulations but, as long as families ensure that children only attend after confirming they have no symptoms of a cold or flu and can confirm that the child has a clear LFT taken on the day of the class, there is currently nothing that should prevent the classes from occurring.

First Holy Communion families are reminded that they should attend the Enrolment Mass at either the 9.30 or 11am Mass, so please respond to Fr Adrian’s email to give an idea of numbers.

Fr Adrian has also emailed the **Confirmation** families, so please check any online folders in case this has not automatically gone into the inbox. **If families cannot find the message please email Fr Adrian by Wednesday 5th January.**

A Christmas Message and Blessing from Pope Francis

Pope Francis gave his traditional Christmas message followed by his ‘Urbi et Orbi’ blessing (‘to the city and the world’) via traditional and online broadcasting. In his opening words he announced “the Word of God, who created the world and who gives meaning to history and to humanity’s journey, became flesh and came to dwell among us.” This event that fills the heart with wonder, he noted, shows how “the Word became flesh in order to dialogue with us,” since “God himself, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is dialogue, an eternal and infinite communion of love and life.” Through Jesus, God showed us the way to encounter and dialogue, “so that we might know it and follow it, in trust and hope.”

The Pope observed that our world needs dialogue, especially in these pandemic times where unity and solidarity are essential to overcoming the hurt in social relationships, putting them to the test. Imagine what our world would be like if it were not for the patient dialogue of so many generous persons trying to keep families and communities together, preventing and resolving conflicts, he said. Despite these shadows, there is “the sign of hope”, the Pope underscored, “the Love that moves the sun and the other stars” became flesh, sharing in our plight and breaking down the walls of indifference. The little child “in need of everything”, came “to give us everything”. The Pope encouraged everyone then to ask the Lord for “the strength to be open to dialogue” and create in our hearts a real desire for “reconciliation and fraternity,” turning to Him in prayer. During this time of pandemic, the Pope prayed in particular for those feeling its affects, especially women who are the victims of violence, children suffering due to bullying, the elderly who are even more isolated. He asked the Lord to give peace of mind and unity to all families and the children they are raising.

The Pope also remembered our need to be attentive to our common home, our planet and the environment suffering from how we often treat it, praying for inspiration for political leaders to reach agreements to assure its viability future generations. Acknowledging and praying over the many challenges we are facing today, the Pope underscored that “hope prevails”, a child is born, who is the Word of God. May we “learn to listen to God, our Father, to listen to one another and to dialogue as brothers and sisters,” he concluded, and ask the Lord to “teach us” to walk beside Him “on the paths of peace.”
