The Parish is currently collecting non-perishable items to be forwarded onto our local Foodbank to donate and which can be left in the box in the Lady Chapel by the Sacred Heart Statue. Some examples of what can be donated are: Breakfast cereals, Pasta, Rice, Pasta sauce, Tinned food such as Soup, Beans, Meat, Vegetables and Fruit, Tea or coffee, Sugar, Biscuits and UHT milk. Exciting development News for the Parish

In addition, now that the Nursery have left the Hall we will be seeking your views on how we can develop the area, with the aim of caring for some of the most vulnerable members of the Parish and community members in need.

Further details will be available from the Parish Finance Committee as part of a Parish wide consultation process.

We are all in difficult financial positions from the current state of our economy and not everyone may be able to pledge financially, but we hope people can donate their time and talents to help the Parish as well.
