



**A message from Fr Adrian:** We have now received the Structural Engineering report this week with recommendations on how best to check and repair the entire ceiling. I am happy to say that, with the scaffolding up in the Central Nave as protection, the Insurance company and the Diocese have confirmed that we can soon reopen to a Sunday Mass. The start of work and the exact date we can open will be confirmed once the repair schedule is agreed, but it is likely to be the second Sunday in September. More details will be given as soon as I have them, but please remember, under Government regulations, we now have to adhere to a safe limit on the number of people coming to Mass. This number which change according to the number of individuals or household / bubble groups attending, but is likely to range from a minimum of 45 unconnected individuals to a maximum mix of up to 90 individuals and families. Details on how to book a seat for our 11 am Sunday Mass as an individual or a family will be sent out when our start date is confirmed. When we can open for Sunday Mass there will be one Mass at 11 am, with Volunteer Stewards needed to clean before and after. Our aim is to build up more Volunteer Stewards so that we can have a 6.30 pm Sunday Mass too, but we don't have enough volunteers yet for this, or for a 9.30 am Mass, so please continue to keep the Parish and our volunteer needs in your prayers. This is a project that we have to totally fund ourselves: there is no grant from the Diocese, from the Vatican or from any charities we could apply to. I have deliberately not chosen to fundraise for the project yet until we can be clear on what the way forward and the total cost will be, but thank you for your concern and patience as we prepare to meet the costs of safely opening up our church again. As soon as I have news I will email out to all the Parish members who have registered their email with us via the link <https://mailchi.mp/c26803e66e8d/stmarymags> **Although this will be the last formal newsletter until the end of August, I will email each week with the Mass schedule and with any urgent news such as the ceiling update.** Naturally, my aim is to be able to return to our normal public schedule of Masses as soon as possible, but this can only be when the church is safe both in terms of the ceiling and with the special preparation and cleanliness needed to tackle Covid-19. If you are seeking for your child to be baptised, please see the note at the bottom of the page as these will begin again before public Mass.

As soon as Fr Adrian has any news he will email the families concerned.
