Assisted suicide: a Threat to the Vulnerable ...

Would you like to come to a talk on Assisted Suicide by Professor David Albert Jones on Wednesday 13th November? Dr Jones is the Director of the Anscombe Bioethics Centre, a Fellow at Blackfriars Hall, Oxford, and the Professor of Bioethics at St Mary's University, Twickenham, and Vice-Chair of the Ministry of Defence Research Ethics Committee. The talk will take place in Richmond at St Elizabeth's Church, The Vineyard, and beginning at 7.30pm. Please note: although there is no on-site parking you can park on the street after 6.30 pm, thank you.

Catholic Nursery and Primary School Applications in 2025.

If you are applying to a Catholic Primary School for next year, please see Fr Adrian after Mass to obtain a form called the "Parish Reference Request". This form gives details of what information the Parish needs (e.g. baptism details and copy certificate) and any school forms for Fr Adrian to complete (i.e. the school "SIF"). These forms are to be handed to Fr Adrian at the end of the usual Sunday Mass you attend. Please remember that at least a week is required to give time to process the forms, so that forms handed in one Sunday, are usually returned the following week. Please see Fr Adrian if you have any questions and please make sure that you are aware of each School's cut-off date.
