## Parish & School News

**Today we celebrate a very different Mother's Day** under the restrictions of Covid-19 regulations which make it mandatory that there are no public celebrations of Mass at which a congregation is present. This is to suppress the spread of the COVID-19 virus among gatherings of people, and, in particular, to protect the most vulnerable. In addition, no other non-Eucharistic services or devotions can be held at which groups of people gather as a congregation.

**However**, the church remains open for private prayer where people can gather to pray individually or as small family groups where social distancing is respected. **The church is open for private prayer daily from 9 am to 11 am and from 5-7pm every Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. On Sundays the church is open from 9am to 3pm.**

These times are posted inside and outside the church, as well as the top right column of each newsletter which is available online and in small numbers from the porch. The work of the Parish continues as, although, except in danger of death, baptisms, confirmations, First Communions and weddings are postponed, visits to the sick and frail and prayers for the dead continue, with funerals celebrated either at the graveside or at the Crematorium with up to five people present.

**At this time of concern throughout the country,

- ✘ **Hygiene:** wear gloves in public places, wash hands regularly for over 20 seconds, use 70% alcohol sanitiser
- ✘ **Home:** is now the heart of prayer as we must stay away from going to public celebrations of Mass
- ✘ **Help:** think positively of ways you can help our Parish Family to care for one another and for your neighbours such as help with shopping and checking all is ok in this time when we need to keep isolated but, whilst keeping a safe distance, can still help to look out for and help to look after one another.
