Parish & School News

Collection details: Our sacrificial giving is part of our participation at Mass and a sharing of the blessings God gives us. **Thank you for your support: our collection last week raised: £577** together with a further £400 (on average) by Standing Order. Our thanks go to those who donate direct into the parish account **to make a total of £978 for the charitable work of the Parish, it is much appreciated.** With continued thanks to those who give by Gift Aid as these sums include monies given through the Parish Gift Aid envelope scheme.

The Catholic Bishops' Conference has issued guidelines about the Coronavirus in order to enable Catholic churches and organisations to find relevant information. At the time of writing, the risk to the public from coronavirus remains low in England and Wales. Because this is a rapidly changing situation, these guidelines may evolve as the situation changes. In the meantime, it is very important to know the latest guidance from Government. The Bishops' guidance focuses on the hygiene measures needed to disrupt the spread of coronavirus should we get a number of cases in England and Wales. - As should be our ordinary practice, it is important that anyone with cold or flu symptoms (or cold sore etc.) should refrain from taking communion from the Chalice and receive the host on the hand only.
- Ministers of the Eucharist should sanitise their hands before and after distributing communion. This can be done by washing hands discreetly before proceeding to the sanctuary or using good quality hand gel.
- Although the Bishops' Conference has not yet called for the Chalice to be withdrawn, concern expressed amongst parish members mean that it is prudent, for the time being, to distribute the Blessed Sacrament only during Holy Communion. The sign of Peace may be given according to individual preference.
