3rd Sunday of Advent: Parish Mass Book p. 88-90 On the third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday) we particularly remember that Advent prepares us for a time of joy; with

the colour rose acting as a symbol of the mix of the purple of penance and preparation joined with the white of the expectation and joy of Christmas. Our Jesse Tree symbols have continued to



remind us of the Old Testament stories of salvation in the history of God's people: the **Passover Lamb**, pointing us again to God's care and the sacrifice that Jesus made for us; the **Ten Commandments**, reminding us of ways that bring out the best in us and how we should try to live our lives, in relation to God and those around us. Ultimately, God's greatest Commandment of Love should be written on our hearts, so that we witness, in action, to God's love. Further symbols of action we had this week were the **Trumpet** that Joshua used to bring down the walls of Jericho in response to God's call; the **Pitcher** represents how Gideon became an

unlikely leader and judge, helping his people cast aside false gods and obey God's true laws; a **Crown** to represent how Samuel anointed David as the King – a forerunner of Christ, the King of Kings – a **Shepherd's Crook** to remind us how David was to look after his people, but which represents Jesus as the true Shepherd who seeks and cares for us always. The **Altar** this Sunday represented the altar built by Elijah and reminds us of the altar of Christ's sacrifice for us.

First Holy Communion News. Please note that the registration process ended over a month ago, with those who signed-up for the programme now entering the next stage of the process, with parents collecting the actual First Communion Application from Fr Adrian after Mass. We have printed an application form for every family who registered. We have 36 children this year, 13 of whom are at other Schools and 7 of whom attend different

Parishes. For children to make their First Holy Communion they should <u>attend Mass each Sunday</u>, and we encourage children to attend our Children's Liturgy at the 9.30 am Mass, though you are welcome to attend any of our Masses. For the 29 families who attend this Parish either at our School, or another one, the last date to collect the Communion Application from Fr Adrian is after Mass this weekend. The 7 families at our School seeking Communion here can collect the application from the School, but they must have the permission of both Fr Adrian and their own Parish Priest to celebrate Communion here. Please note, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16th December. Those at the Parish School can drop their forms

there and the School will forward them, if you are one of the 13 families at other Schools, please return your form to Fr Adrian in person after Mass. Don't forget, the forms have to be returned by Friday 16th December, thank you.
