Fourth Sunday of Advent: Parish Mass Book p. 90

Our Jesse Tree symbols this week began with Hezekiah's **Tent** to remind us of God's presence in difficult times, and the **Ember and Tongs** to represent how we too, like Isaiah, can be cleansed of our sins by the Lord and speak out



his word to others. The **Tears** of Jeremiah, represented his grief at how God's people had turned from the Lord; Habakkuk's **Watchtower**, symbolised his waiting in watchfulness upon the day of the Lord's coming; with Nehemiah's **Wall** around Jerusalem standing for how it should be kept a holy place (a sad reference to the division in the Holy Land today and how the current wall around Jerusalem keeps people out). Next we have our first reference to the New Testament, with a **Scallop Shell** symbolising John's baptism and our own Christian journey of pilgrimage as we await the Lord's return. this Sunday's symbol of the White **Lily** symbolises the purity of Mary, the Handmaid of the Lord, and our hope in the dawn of life eternal.

The **Carpenter's Hammer** represents Joseph's profession and his unique role in the story of our salvation; followed by a symbol representing the **Motherhood** of Mary and her cousin Elizabeth. The next symbol represents how Elizabeth's husband, Zechariah, used a **Writing Tablet**, to proclaim the name of John the Baptist, followed by the **White Candle**, symbolizing Christ; the light of the world and reminding us of the white candle of our Advent wreath which will be lit at the celebration of the Nativity of our Lord. The Nativity is represented on our Jesse Tree by the **Manger** that cradled the infant Jesus and on Christmas Day we place the last of our symbols, the **Chi-Rho** monogram, a combination of the first two letters for the Greek word of Christos, Christ – the true Light that came into the world on the first Christmas Day. **As we draw nearer to Christmas let us remember in prayer all those who find this a time of difficulty and hardship, God bless, Fr Adrian.**

A message from Fr Adrian: This coming year will see our 170th Anniversary and though during the three and a half years I have been with the Parish we have had many months when we had to close for the Pandemic, it is wonderful that we can safely open and gather for Mass. Although we still have to keep safe and take care, when we are able to be together, it is the reality of such communion together, in our own and wider families, that gives us strength to draw on and, most especially, the strength God gives us in our lives from our spiritual and physical reception of his Blessing and Holy Communion.

Through 2020 and 2021 we have had to spend nearly £200,000 in urgent safety repairs in the Church, Hall and Cemetery and have a further £15,000 of repairs immediately in the new Year, with £500,000 of further planned repairs to come. Over the Pandemic we have not being able to undertake any major fundraising and we will need to do so during our Anniversary Year so we can continue to be Stewards of the wonderful buildings, projects and people of the Parish. **I would like to thank our Parish Finance and Building Committee members who have helped with this work and first Clare and then Anna who came to help in the Parish office over the course of Lockdown and beyond. We are indebted and give thanks to all those who support the Parish throughout the year by donating and volunteering in so many ways.** Although we've had to work very differently together for many months, it is a blessing to have the support of those who have been able to help as Readers, Extraordinary ministers, Welcomers, catechists, musicians and singers; those who've helped with the collection, our flower arrangers, church cleaners, linen cleaners and lately our Altar Servers. Thank you to you all - may we know the Lord's Blessing throughout the year ahead.
