### 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time: Parish Mass Book p. 129

This Sunday we celebrate the 'Sunday of the Word of God', a day instituted by Pope Francis on the Feast of St Jerome in 2019, devoted to the celebration and study of Sacred Scripture and continues our week of Prayer for Christian Unity.

Fr Adrian had mentioned over the last couple of weeks that we have had to spend nearly £200,000 in urgent safety repairs to the Church, Hall and Cemetery over the last few years. Before Christmas we began work on a further £17,000 of repairs that were immediately due and, although remedial repairs to the Hall roof and urgent safety repairs to the flat roof over the garage and cemetery walkway have been completed, we still need to complete the renovation of the 'old shop' so that we can use this for Parish functions in warm weather. Since his appointment in July 2019, Fr Adrian has committed the Parish to ensuring that we adhere to invaluable Health and Safety property survey reports, which show that we have £500,000 of planned repairs to come. Over the Pandemic we were not able to undertake any major fundraising but, as 2022 is our 170<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Year, we hope to be able to begin to raise funds so that we can continue to be Stewards of the wonderful buildings, projects and people of our Parish.

Fr Adrian is aided in this Stewardship by the Finance and Building Committee which is made up of representative members of the Parish. Next month we will publish reviews of our careful management of our resources and plans for how we can "build together for the future". **Changes to the way the Diocese manage our accounts mean that we need to employ a part-time Parish Financial Administrator.** First Clare and then Anna came to help in the Parish office over the course of Lockdown and beyond as temporary helpers and Fr Adrian is very grateful for all their help as we seek to establish how we can manage our future admin needs.

**This Sunday, 23 January, is the 'Sunday of the Word of God' - a day, instituted by Pope Francis on the Feast of St Jerome in 2019, devoted to the celebration and study of Sacred Scripture.** Pope Francis says "Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world." Fr Adrian has broadened the Archbishop's gratitude to our Readers and Extraordinary Ministers to all ministries who helped to maintain the Parish during the Pandemic, as mentioned in last week's newsletter and as below, but on the 'Sunday of the Word of God' we pray especially in gratitude for those who serve in the Ministry of Reader, a special form of Lay Ministry open to the women and men of our Parish who both live and follow fully the Scripture and Teaching of the Church and have been appointed in their ministry (as with Extraordinary Ministers) after prayerful discernment, training and the approval of the Bishop.

**At the end of the second full Lockdown, Archbishop John asked Parish Priests to draw together lists of Parish members who had helped as Stewards (Welcomers), Readers and Extra-Ordinary Ministers throughout the Lockdown period.**

On hearing of this, Fr Adrian wanted to extend the list of helpers as we have had volunteers helping with live-streaming when the church was closed, had cleaners keeping us safe when we could open, and volunteers who helped to ensure the beauty and safety of the cemetery and church grounds. **It may not have been possible to include everyone, but our 'thank you list' was drawn up from the rotas of those who helped from the first Lockdown in March 2020 until the church was able to open up again from Holy Week 2021.** The list below (alphabetically by surname) **gives the names of people who have not yet collected their certificates**, so please see Fr Adrian at the end of Mass to collect yours.

**Naturally, not everyone is in a position to be able to help us and over half the congregation have not yet returned to Mass, but our 'thank you list' symbolises all those who help in any way, even solely by your prayers.
