Prepare the Way... As we learnt last week, we symbolize our journey to Christmas through our purple linen (representing the colour of preparation and penance); the gradual lighting of our Advent candles, the Magi on their journey to Christ, our 'gift of prayer' labels and Jesse Tree on our sanctuary. As we learnt last week, we symbolize our journey to Christmas through our purple linen: the colour of preparation and penance; the gradual lighting of our Advent candles, the Magi on their journey to Christ and the prayer-lights, prayer-cards and Jesse Tree symbols on our sanctuary. Over the course of last week we placed the first symbols of our Jesse Tree: a dove reminding us of the peace and harmony of creation as God intended; a fruit representing the original sin of Adam and Eve to remind us that Jesus is the New Adam who wipes away that sin. Noah's ark, reminded us of God's covenant to save his people; then we had the **burning bush** to represent the presence of the Lord and our personal response to how God calls each of us, even today. Our next symbol was a ram, representing the sacrifice Abraham made to God and a link to the ultimate sacrifice of God's own Son; then came Joseph's sacks of grain to represent God's provision, even in difficult times. On Friday (the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary) we placed a White Lily to symbolise the purity of Mary, the Handmaid of the Lord, and our hope in the dawn of life eternal. On Sunday we have two icons representing God's Covenant of protection and provision through the **Passover Lamb** (a symbol of the Sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb of God) at the Family Mass and the 11am Mass our symbol shows how God's people are as countless as the number of **stars** in the sky.

Can you spare some time to help decorate our Church at Christmas? If so, please come along and join the team from 17th to 19th Dec., and again on Sat. 23rd to help decorate our church and tree. If you can donate a Poinsettia to help decorate the church, please bring them to Mass up to Sat. 23rd, thank you.

Catholic Primary School applications for 2024

If you're applying to a Catholic Primary School for next year, please see Fr Adrian, after Mass, to obtain a form called the "Parish Reference Request". This form gives details of what information the Parish needs (e.g. baptism details and copy certificate) plus any School forms for Fr Adrian to complete (i.e. the School "SIF"). These forms are to be handed to Fr Adrian at the end of the usual Sunday Mass you attend. Please remember that at least a week is needed to give time to process the forms, so that forms handed-in one Sunday, are usually returned the following week. Please see Fr Adrian if you have any questions and please make sure that you are aware of each School's cut-off date.
