#### 27<sup>th</sup> April 2025: 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Easter Mass Book p. 259-262

Today we especially remember the life of Sir James Marshall and his wife Lady Alice Marshall. The son of James Marshall (1796-1855) an Anglican Vicar, James Marshall Junior was educated at Exeter College, Oxford and went on to join the military. He lost his right arm through a gun accident and entered the Church of England as a cleric. At 28 he was moved to become a Catholic and began teaching. He was called to the bar at Lincoln's Inn in 1866 and in 1873 he was appointed chief magistrate of the Gold Coast (now Ghana) and assessor to the native chiefs. The chiefs took his amputation as an indication that Sir James was a War Hero and soon took confidence in him. Through the witness he was able to give to his faith, Sir James established the first Catholic Church in Ghana after the Portuguese had left many years before. Sir James was involved in the 2nd Ashanti war (1873) and received the Ashanti medal. In 1876, he was promoted to senior puisne judge of the supreme court of the Gold Coast. James became a chief justice in 1879 and was knighted in 1882. He was Executive commissioner for the West African colonies at the Indian and Colonial Exhibition 1886 and afterwards created CMG. Sir James and his wife Lady Alice Marshall are buried in our Cemetery and their grave is to be found to the right of the Burton Mausoleum as you face the tomb entrance. All are welcome, after the 11 am Mass, to join us for prayers at their graveside, thank you.

As we are welcoming the Knights and Ladies of Marshall today at the 11 am Mass on Sunday 4th May, the monthly collection for the care and maintenance of our Parish has been moved to 18<sup>th</sup> May, the week after our Spring Fair.

On Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> May we will have the annual opportunity of making a contribution to the Priest Training Fund (Ecclestical Education) at all our Masses. This Fund helps to meet the cost of training students for the priesthood and the permanent diaconate. It also helps to support ongoinging formation of the clergy, thank you.

On Thursday we remember and give thanks, on this 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary, for the end of World War II in Europe, also known as "VE Day". Sadly, the war continued in the Far East until August 8<sup>th</sup> when we will then commemorate "VJ Day". These special days are are not designed to glorify War but a time to remember everyone who gave their lives for others, for all those who stayed "at home", trying to keep their own and the lives of their families as normal as possible. There will be many commemorations of "VE Day" during this Bank Holiday week, but a special invitation goes out to all who can come along to the Parish School celebrations from 4.30-6.30pm on 8<sup>th</sup> May, tickets are £5 per adult and £3 per child.
